- difficulties in learning

Office for Students with Disabilities

- providing information to students and teachers
- activities to overcome physical barriers to all university members
- address the specific needs of individual students with disabilities (providing sign language interpreters for the adjustment of the literature in Braille printing, insurance, transportation, insurance, personal assistant, purchasing supplies, etc.)
- support students with disabilities in their adjustment and full social integration
- initiate the amendment of laws and regulations that prevent students with disabilities in realizing their rights and obligations

Grants for students with disabilities

- State scholarships

- Scholarships from city of Zagreb

- Scholarships to blind students (Hrvatska zaklada za školovanje slijepih / Croatian Foundation for Education of the Blind)



Benefit form scholarships



- Benefits are mostly in cash aid
- scholarships are given for one year
- Students are applying through open competition
- limited number of scholarships

Transportation for students with disabilities

- full time students from more than 60% of physical disability
- students who fulfill their obligations

without permanent employment

- duration is one academic year

Conclusion

- students with physical disabilities barriers are spatial
- students with visual impairments- approach to literature
- students with hearing- unresolved issue of funding for sign language interpreters
- students with chronic illnesses and those with mental disorders- need flexibility in deadlines set of student commitment
